

PBS Newshour Weekend Premieres Sept. 7 on WFYI Public Television Program will be Extension of One of America's Most Iconic News Broadcasts

NewsHour Weekend will join PBS' trusted lineup of news and public affairs shows starting **Saturday, September 7**. The new 30-minute program, which will air **Saturdays** & **Sundays** at **6 pm** on **WFYI 1 Public Television**, will be anchored by *PBS NewsHour's* senior correspondent **Hari Sreenivasan** and originate from WNET's Tisch Studios in New York.

Each weekend broadcast will feature original, in-depth field reporting on topics including education, healthcare, the economy, energy, science, technology, religion, finance and the arts. **PBS**NewsHour Weekend will employ a team of multimedia producers who will efficiently utilize the latest broadcast technology. Social media will be fully integrated into the program, allowing for dynamic conversation with viewers.

Additionally, on **Monday, September 9, Gwen Ifill** and **Judy Woodruff** will officially begin their new duties as co-anchors and managing editors for the **PBS NewsHour**. It marks the first time that a network broadcast has had a female co-anchor team. Ifill and Woodruff will anchor the broadcast together Monday through Thursday each week. On Fridays, Woodruff will anchor solo as Ifill hosts **Washington Week** that evening. The **PBS NewsHour** can be seen weekdays at **6 pm** on **WFYI 1** and **7 pm** on **WFYI 3**.
