NEW DRAMA CHOICES

BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES

4x90 | 2014 – Prime New Zealand



Detective Inspector Mike Shepherd (Neill Rea, *Go Girls*) arrives on assignment in Brokenwood, a small town where memories—and animosities—run deep. He's an experienced cop with a 1971 "classic" car, a collection of country music cassettes, and an indeterminate number of ex-wives. The new woman in his life is his assistant, Detective Constable Kristin Sims (Fern Sutherland, *The Almighty Johnsons*), a by-the-book investigator nearly 20 years younger than her boss's car, who quickly has to get used to his lone-wolf ways.

PARTNERS IN CRIME

6x60 | 2013 - BBC

Belgian detective Hercule Poirot and spinster sleuth Miss Marple weren't Dame Agatha Christie's only creations. She also invented Tommy and Tuppence Beresford, an ordinary married couple who stumble into spycraft and end up being rather good at it. In these sparkling new adaptations of two classic mysteries, set in 1950s Britain at the start of the Cold War, Tommy (David Walliams (*Little Britain*) and Tuppence (Jessica Raine, *Call The Midwife, Wolf Hall*) return to the small screen, bickering, sweet on each other, and soon knee-deep in danger.



MISS FISHER MURDER MYSTERIES

The Honorable Miss Phryne Fisher (Essie Davis, *Girl with a Pearl Earring*) is a thoroughly modern woman of the late 1920s operating in a mostly male world. The glamorous "lady detective" goes about her work with a pistol close at hand—and, more often than not, a male admirer even closer. Gorgeously costumed and evocatively shot, *Miss Fisher's Murder Mysteries* also stars Hugo Johnstone-Burt (*Cloudstreet*), Ashleigh Cummings (*Tomorrow, When the War Began*), Miriam Margolyes (*Little Dorrit*), Nicholas Bell (*Shine*). Miranda Otto (*The Lord of the Rings*) guest stars.

DOC MARTIN

Dr. Martin Ellingham, a London-based surgeon, relocates to the picturesque seaside village of Portwenn, establishing himself as the area's general practitioner. He grew up in the area having been raised by his now widowed Aunt Joan Norton. His reasons for leaving London and the high-paid life of a consultant are not clear initially but related to a phobia he has recently developed. He soon meets several of the locals and eccentricity abounds. Martin's situation is made more difficult by what can only be referred as an almost complete lack of



an acceptable bedside manner. He is gruff, abrupt and intolerant, not only in issues related to medicine, but to life in general. He and the headmistress of the local school, Louisa Glasson, are clearly attracted to each other and despite their awkwardness, slowly develop a relationship.

A specialist in the study of psychic mediums, Robert is invited to an 'evening of clairvoyance' where he meets Alison Mundy (Lesley Sharp, *Cranford, Scott & Bailey*). Reluctant and cautious, she is a far cry from the fraudulent psychics that sceptic Robert is used to. Alison is different. Ever since she was a child she has seen spirits and, after a near-death experience, they have taken over her life. Driven by a compulsion to help those around her, Alison seeks to resolve relationships torn apart by death.

Freddie was a budding actor and Stuart worked in a bar when they first met, but their careers are pretty much over and their lives now consist of entertaining their frequent guests, making sure that their aged dog Balthazar is still breathing, and hurling caustic insults at each other.

A British/French crime drama, adapted from the Danish/Swedish crime series *The Bridge*. The series stars Stephen Dillane (*Game of Thrones*, *The Hours*) and Clémence Poésy (*Harry Potter*, *The Hollow Crown*) as British and French police detectives Karl Roebuck and Elise Wasserman. The two detectives work together to find a serial killer who left the upper-half body of a French politician and the lower-half of a British prostitute in the Channel Tunnel, at the midpoint between France and the UK. They later learn that the killer -- who comes to be nicknamed the "Truth Terrorist" -- is on a moral

crusade to highlight many social problems, terrorizing both countries in the process. As the series progresses, the killer's true intention is revealed.

DANCING ON THE EDGE

Written and directed by Stephen Poliakoff, This eight-part drama tells the story of a black jazz band in London in the early 1930s. The band is made up of British citizens, and American and Caribbean musicians on work visas, trying to crack the dance halls and radio playlists. But soon the story takes a more serious turn. The cast includes Chiwetel Ejiofor (*Endgame, 12 Years a Slave*), Matthew Goode (*Downton Abbey*), Joanna Vanderham (*The Paradise*), Jacqueline Bisset (*Bullitt, Murder on the Orient Express*) and John Goodman (*The Big Lebowski, The West Wing*).



JULY - FALL 2016

INSPECTOR LEWIS (Masterpiece) Summer 2016



For the final series of Lewis, Kevin Whately and Laurence Fox have, once again, reprised their roles as the 'perfect' detective team solving murders against the backdrop of the university spires of Oxford alongside Angela Griffin as DS Lizzie Maddox. A new Chief Superindendent soon clashes with Lewis over his more 'traditional' approach to detective work. Over the course of the final series, a revelation about his father causes Hathaway to feel tremendous guilt. In an attempt to avoid facing his father and his personal strife, Hathaway throws himself into his work. After years of avoiding the thorny issue of family

ties, has James left it too late to be reunited with the man his father once was?

THE HOLLOW CROWN (Great Performances) Season 2 Summer 2016 | 3x120

Tells the story of *The Wars of the Roses*, a medieval chronicle spanning rebellion in France, the rise and fall of Joan of Arc, the terror of England's Civil War, and the deceitful dynastic murders culminating in the infamous reign of Richard III. The three-part sequel series boasts an absolutely all-star cast that might actually be more impressive than the original: Benedict Cumberbatch (*Sherlock*) stars as King Richard III; Dame Judi Dench (*Cranford, As Time Goes By*) as Cecily, Duchess of York; Keeley Hawes (*Upstairs, Downstairs*) as Elizabeth Woodville; Hugh



Bonneville (*Downton Abbey*) as Humphrey, Duke of Glouchester; Sophie Okonedo (*The Escape Artist*) as Queen Margaret of Anjou, Michael Gambon (*Page Eight, The King's Speech*) as Sir Edmund Mortimer.

HOME FIRES (Masterpiece) Season 2 Fall 2016 | 6x60



At the heart of a rural English village on the verge of the Second World War, a diverse group of women with personal struggles, conflicting views, and a shared mission forge a community that will inspire their finest hour.

INDIAN SUMMERS ON MASTERPIECE Season 2 Fall 2016 | 10x60

Set against the sweeping grandeur of the Himalayas and tea plantations of Northern India, this scripted drama tells the rich and explosive story of the decline of the British Empire and the birth of modern India, from both sides of the experience.



POLDARK ON MASTERPIECE Season 2 Fall 2016 | 8x60

Based on the Winston Graham novels, the series follows the rebellious Ross Poldark as he returns from the American War of Independence to Cornwall, discovering that his home country has changed since he has been away.



REMEMBER ME Fall 2016 | 3x60



When pensioner Tom Parfitt, played by Michael Palin, stages a fall in his eerie Yorkshire home in order to escape into residential care, a chilling and macabre mystery unfolds.

It's been more than two decades since Michael Palin played it straight in a lead TV role. From the first scene you could see why Palin had chosen to make his grand re-entrance with the character of Tom Parfitt.

ROYAL WIVES AT WAR Fall 2016 | 1x60

Royal Wives at War reveals the inside story of two women, Queen Elizabeth (Emma Davies, *Cambridge Spies*) and Wallis Simpson (Gina McKee, *The Forsyte Saga, Notting Hill*), from opposite ends of society, and a private dispute with seismic political, cultural, and constitutional repercussions.



TBA: LATE 2016 & BEYOND

SCOTT & BAILEY 22x50



A thrilling investigative drama exploring the personal and professional lives of two female detectives, from award-winning writer Sally Wainwright (*Last Tango in Halifax*). Detective Constable Rachel Bailey (Suranne Jones, *The Crimson Field*) is 30, down-to-earth, noisy, argumentative and single. Her partner, Detective Constable Janet Scott (Lesley Sharp, *Cranford, Afterlife*), is 40, a diplomat and a thinker, as well as being a wife and mother. They both work for Manchester Metropolitan Police's prestigious Murder Investigation Team and, despite the obvious differences between

them, the fact that they are often thrown together in difficult situations means they have developed a robust friendship. Each episode sees Rachel and Janet face a serious crime that is both challenging and emotionally difficult as well as cope with their own complex personal lives.

FATHER BROWN SEASON 4 10x50

Father Brown returns for a forth series, derived from the classic short stories of G K Chesterton. One of the most quirkily genial and lovable characters to emerge from English detective fiction, the kindly cleric with his large umbrella and numerous brown paper parcels, possesses a sharp intelligence, and limitless knowledge of men's evil. He works using intuition, shaped by his experiences as a priest and confessor.



CHURCHILL'S SECRET (Masterpiece) 2016 | 1x120



Set during the summer months of 1953, Churchill (Michael Gambon, *Page Eight, The King's Speech*)—now Prime Minister for the second time and in his late 70s—suffers a life-threatening stroke, which is kept secret from the world. Told from the viewpoint of his young Nurse, Millie Appleyard (Romola Garai, *The Hour*), the drama follows his battle to recover as his long suffering wife Clemmie (Lindsay Duncan, *Sherlock, The Hollow Crown*), desperately hopes the stroke will force Winston to retire while his political friends and foe scheme to plot who will succeed him. Meanwhile his adult children (Matthew Macfadyen, *Any Human Heart, MI-5* as Randolph Churchill; Daisy

Lewis, *Downton Abbey*, as Mary Churchill; Rachael Stirling, *The Bletchley Circle*, as Sarah Churchill; Tara Fitzgerald, *Game of Thrones*, as Diana Churchill) descend on Chartwell, unsure if he will pull through, as tensions within his family begin to surface.

VICTORIA (Masterpiece)

Winter 2017 | 8 episodes

Victoria, the highly anticipated new drama series about the epic life of Queen Victoria, will air on MASTERPIECE on PBS in 2017 in the Sunday night time slot which *Downton Abbey* has occupied for six years. Jenna Coleman

(*Doctor Who*) stars as the young Victoria, a tiny (4' 11"), neglected teenager who overnight became Queen and eventually the most powerful woman in the world. The eightpart drama follows Victoria from the time she becomes Queen in 1837 at the age of 18, through her courtship and marriage to Prince Albert. Famous for her candor and spirit, she was the first woman who seemed to



have it all: a passionate marriage, nine children, and the job of being Queen of the world's most important nation. Victoria's often tumultuous reign lasted for 63 years; she was England's longest-serving monarch until she was overtaken by Elizabeth II in September, 2015.

SIX WIVES OF HENRY VIII WITH LUCY WORSLEY (w.t.)

Winter/Spring 2017 | 3x60



Host Lucy Worsley revisits the court of the infamous Henry VIII to challenge the archetypes of his equally well-known wives and truly examine their individual stories. Featuring both drama and documentary aspects, this series provides a time-traveling guide to help viewers delve into one of the famously misunderstood periods of British history
